Recoveries Report for the period ended 30 June 2017

GF/B38/17 14-15 November 2017, Geneva, Switzerland

Board Information

Purpose of the paper: This report, previously shared with the Audit and Finance Committee, is provided to the Board for information. It contains background information and updated tables regarding the status of non-compliant expenditures identified by the Office of the Inspector General ("OIG") as of 30 June 2017, as well as recoverable amounts identified in the due course of grant management operations as of 30 June 2017. The OIG reports independently to the Board on the Secretariat's progress on matters related to recoveries.



Executive Summary

The Secretariat develops updates on recoveries cases twice per year. This report, previously presented to the Audit & Finance Committee in October 2017, is provided to the Board for information. It contains background information and updated tables regarding the status of non-compliant expenditures identified by the Office of the Inspector General ("OIG") as of 30 June 2017, as well as recoverable amounts identified in the due course of grant management operations as of 30 June 2017. The AFC did not raise any issues with the information presented in this report.

During the first half of 2017, the total outstanding OIG recoverable balance, net of written commitments to repay, declined by US\$ 6.5 million to US\$ 11.1 million. The US\$ 11.1 million total outstanding recoverable balance, net of written commitments, demonstrates resolution of 90% of the aggregate recoverable amount over time (up from 85% as of 31 December 2016). The 90% results from both an increase in resolution of recoveries case and a decreasing trend in new cases.

Turnaround times for new cases continue to improve compared to 'legacy' cases, i.e., pre-2014. The improvement with respect to legacy cases reflects the more rigorous approach to recoveries referred to in previous reports with the Global Fund seeing considerable benefits, notably, recoverable funds are being returned more quickly than was the case several years ago. In the last eight quarters, the Secretariat had US\$ 22.4 million in new cases of which US\$ 15.8 million were recovered as of 30 June 2017.

The non-OIG aggregate outstanding balance due increased slightly from US\$ 41.1 million at 31 December 2016 to US\$ 41.8 million. Backing out the non-ordinary course re-statement of US\$ 3.8 million from OIG to non-OIG recoverable amounts and the one-off booking of a Government of Ghana recoverable amount on account of the Central Medical Store warehouse fire of US\$ 27.4 million, the aggregate outstanding balance due increased slightly from US\$ 9.9 million to US\$ 10.6 million.

Input Sought

1. There are no specific actions required for Secretariat, OIG, Board or Committees emanating from this report.

What is the topic of this update?

- 2. The Global Fund is fully committed to the principles of transparency and accountability. To fulfill this commitment, the Global Fund works, through its risk management and assurance processes, to expose irregularities and misuse of resources. Key measures are dedicated towards prevention but where irregularities or misuse have materialized, action is taken to address the underlying weaknesses and seek recoveries as appropriate.
- 3. The Global Fund maintains a zero tolerance approach to fraud and corruption and aims to take swift and appropriate action when cases of misuse of funds are identified. The Global Fund will continue to ensure that all identified irregularities are communicated responsibly and in a timely manner to the Board and to other stakeholders.
- 4. At its Thirty-Second Meeting in November 2014, the Board decided to update the reporting methodology for losses and recoveries to better reflect developments in the respective roles of the OIG and the Secretariat in identifying non-compliant expenditures and pursuing recovery of any related amounts (GF/B32/DP04). The updated process also maintains respect for the OIG's independence by providing for a Secretariat-issued Recoveries Report describing the status of recoveries cases relating to published OIG reports, while allowing the OIG to independently report on the Secretariat's recovery process and progress on recoveries instead of jointly issuing a report with the Secretariat. The Recoveries Report is submitted for review to the Audit and Finance Committee (AFC).
- 5. Furthermore, under GF/B32/DP04, the Board requested the Secretariat to develop a methodology and format for future reporting on recoverable amounts identified in the normal course of grant management operations (i.e., unrelated to non-compliant expenditures identified in OIG reports). The approach proposed by the Secretariat was approved by the AEC under decision point GF/AEC11/DP05, pursuant to its delegated authority. This report includes information on such normal course recoverable amounts.
- 6. Reports on amounts identified as compromised by various compliance issues and on the Secretariat's efforts to seek refunds from recipients should be read in full awareness of the context and broad environment within which the Global Fund operates. Specifically, the Global Fund works in countries where often governance, programmatic and oversight capacities are weak and this carries inherent financial and programmatic risks.
- 7. When the OIG publishes audit or investigation reports that include the identification of non-compliant expenditures, the Secretariat identifies an appropriate amount to recover, taking into account the Global Fund's legal right to recover, Global Fund policies and procedures, the financial loss to the program, relevant business and political implications, and the specific facts of the case, and engages in a process to seek recovery of such amount. All OIG recoverable amounts are approved by the Executive Director, upon the recommendation of the Recoveries Committee.
- 8. The Secretariat continued to implement a (for the time being, manual) process to centrally capture and report on confirmed non-compliant expenditures that arise in the ordinary course of grant management. Non-OIG recoverable amount data is collected each quarter from Country Teams and offers a snapshot of a rolling total, i.e., the majority of these instances are typically resolved within the 60 day time period accorded by the Global Fund as opposed to the longer timeframes experienced in relation to OIG recoverable amounts. In the event that they are not resolved within specified timeframes these instances are reported to the Recoveries Committee for their review and recommendation in accordance with guidance provided to Country Teams.
- 9. Recoverable amounts are recorded in the Global Fund's financial statements in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS). The net recoverable amounts in this report may be different from those presented in the financial statements due to the accounting method adopted to comply with the requirements of IFRS. For example, the OIG may release a report which is then reflected in this report but converting the findings into a demand letter (which is then booked in the financial statements) may not take place until after the reporting period and may also reflect adjustments on recommendation by the

Recoveries Committee and approval by the Executive Director. It should be noted that the Financial Statements reporting on losses and recoveries uses the exact same underlying data as that presented within the tables below, and that a formal reconciliation process is implemented and validated through the Recoveries Committee.

What is the current status?

OIG Recoverable Amounts

- 10. With respect to open OIG investigation reports, which are reflected in the amounts in Tables 1 3, the Secretariat uses as a starting point the proposed recoverable amount indicated by the OIG in the investigation reports rather than the total non-compliant amount, given that the total non-compliant amount includes amounts that may not be recoverable because, for example, the associated services or goods have been delivered to the grants. The historical difference between total non-compliant expenditures and the proposed recoverable amounts identified in OIG investigation reports from March 2009 through 30 June 2017 amounted to US\$ 42.7 million. Specifically for the first half of 2017, the total non-compliant expenditures amounted to US\$ 3,940, of which there was no difference between the total non-compliant expenditures identified in OIG investigation reports and the proposed recoverable amounts.
- 11. As OIG audit reports typically do not include a proposed recoverable amount, the Secretariat, with input from the OIG, determines the appropriate recoverable amount based on the content of the OIG audit report. This recoverable amount is then presented to Recoveries Committee's review and subsequent recommendation to the Executive Director for approval.
- 12. Table 1 provides an overview as of 30 June 2017.
- 13. Table 2 presents the detailed country-by-country data for OIG-reported open cases as of 30 June 2017.
- 14. Table 3 presents the detailed country-by-country data for OIG-reported open cases reported during the eight quarters ended 30 June 2017, i.e. 01.07.2015 30.06.2017.
- 15. Fully resolved OIG-reported cases feature in Table 4 as of 30 June 2017.
- 16. Table 5 features OIG-reported cases that were fully resolved during the eight quarters ended 30 June 2017, i.e. 01.07.2015 30.06.2017.
- 17. Table 6 presents the detailed country-by-country data for OIG-reported cases that were opened and closed during the eight quarters ended 30 June 2017, i.e. 01.07.2015 30.06.2017.
- 18. Table 7 presents a summary of recoverable amounts identified in the due course of grant management.
- 19. Table 8 presents a summary of OIG Audit & Investigation Reports as of 30 June 2017 where the amounts reported were deemed as lacking sufficient supporting documentation at the time of the reports to arrive at a final recoverable amount and follow-up work is still ongoing to determine such amounts.
- 20. The Operational Policy Note (OPN) laying out specific guidance related to recoveries was approved by the EGMC in May 2017. In addition to the release of the OPN, a series of related trainings for the Grant Management Division were carried out by the Senior Recoveries Officer in June 2017.
- 21. During the six-month period ended 30 June 2017, there were two new cases presented to Recoveries Committee with an aggregate recoverable amount of US\$ 0.2 million. Of this amount, the Mutambara Foundation represented US\$ 191,000, and Pakistan represented US\$ 1,060. Only one of the cases, Cambodia for US\$ 3,940, published by the OIG during the six-month period ended 30 June 2017 was not presented by the applicable Country Team to the Recoveries Committee during such period. The Cambodia case was subsequently presented to the Recoveries Committee in July 2017.

- 22. Mutambara Foundation: on 15 December 2016, the OIG found fraudulent practices by the AGO Mutambara Science and Technology Foundation and its Director as well as non-compliance with Procurement Regulations by the Global Fund's Sourcing Department, in connection with two consultancy contracts relating to the detection of counterfeit medicines in Global Fund-financed African supply chains. The OIG concluded that the contractors submitted plagiarized work to the Global Fund, and identified a proposed recoverable amount of US\$191,000, corresponding to the entire value of the contracts. The Recoveries Committee discussed this matter at length and sought and received advice from different areas of the Secretariat. While the contracts at issue were breached, a number of considerations complicated the situation, reduced any potential claim by the Global Fund and argued against seeking recovery. On this basis, the Recoveries Committee recommended, and the Executive Director approved, that given the totality of the facts and circumstances, the recoverable amount recommended by the OIG be adjusted to zero.
- 23. During the first half of 2017, further good progress was made: US\$ 4.7 million was recovered and credited to the Global Fund's bank accounts, relating to cases for which demand letters were sent as well as cases subject to Reimbursement Protocols. Cases with an aggregate recoverable amount of US\$ 2.7 million were closed in the first half of 2017. Since the inception of the recoveries process, a total amount of US\$ 70.1 million has been recovered and written commitments for a further US\$ 15.9 million have been obtained.
- 24. The total outstanding recoverable balance, net of written commitments to repay, declined by US\$ 6.5 million to US\$ 11.1 million¹.
- 25. The US\$ 11.1 million total outstanding recoverable balance, net of written commitments, demonstrates resolution of 90% of the aggregate recoverable amount over time (up from 85% as of 31 December 2016). The 90% results from both an increase in resolution of recoveries case and a decreasing trend in new cases.
- 26. Graph 1 below illustrates the evolution of the total amount deemed recoverable (all cases) and the net recoverable outstanding amounts for the previous three years.



¹ The Secretariat notes that in the recent OIG audit report: Limited scope review of the Secretariat's Recoveries Report for the period up to 31 December 2015, dated 30 August 2016, the OIG indicated that the total outstanding recoverable balance as of 31 December 2015, net of written commitments to repay, that the OIG was able to verify amounted to US\$ 39.1 million while the Secretariat-reported amount was US\$ 38.2 million. The discrepancy results from a difference of US\$ 1.0 million in the gross recoverable amount the OIG was able to verify and a difference of US\$ 1.9 million in the amount the OIG was able to verify as recovered. The Secretariat is working with the OIG to reconcile the figures but for the purpose of this report, the Secretariat is basing the figures on the Secretariat-reported amounts.

27. All OIG-related recoveries concerning grants implemented by UNDP in the Democratic Republic of the Congo have been settled, with the exception of US\$ 0.5 million where PSI was the sub-recipient. The Global Fund and UNDP continue to work together diligently to resolve the remaining amount.

28. Turnaround times for new cases continue to improve compared to 'legacy' cases, i.e., pre-2014. The improvement with respect to legacy cases reflects the more rigorous approach to recoveries referred to in previous reports and the Global Fund is seeing considerable benefits: recoverable funds are being returned more quickly than was the case several years ago. In the last eight quarters, the Secretariat had US\$ 22.4 million in new cases of which US\$ 15.8 million were recovered as of 30 June 2017. Of the US\$ 6.6 million outstanding, US\$ 5.2 million is related to the Government of Nigeria where the Secretariat has a signed letter of commitment indicating reimbursement by no later than 31 December 2017.

Non-OIG Recoverable Amounts

29. As of 30 June 2017, the aggregate outstanding balance due increased from US\$ 41.1 million at 31 December 2016 to US\$ 41.8 million and is distributed across 36 countries (51 Principal Recipients). Backing out the non-ordinary course re-statement of US\$ 3.8 million from OIG to non-OIG recoverable amounts and the one-off booking of a Government of Ghana recoverable amount on account of the Central Medical Store warehouse fire described below of US\$ 27.4 million, the aggregate outstanding balance due increased slightly from US\$ 9.9 million to US\$ 10.6 million.

30. Of this US\$ 41.8 million, there are three Principal Recipients that account for approximately 82.7% of the total outstanding amount due, as follows:

a) Government of Ghana: US\$ 27.7 million (66.3%)

The Central Medical Store warehouse in Accra was destroyed in a fire in January 2015. As a result, the Global Fund financed programs lost approximately US\$ 27.4 million worth of health products. There was no insurance contract in place. In light of significant macro-economic difficulties in Ghana and the fact that Ghana likely would not be able to repay US\$27.4 million, the Country Team and senior management recommended to accept a payment-in-kind approach up to the full amount of the loss on the condition that the Government of Ghana (i) implements specific supply chain reforms (which has been the major bottleneck for programs), (ii) repays other outstanding recoverable amounts without delay (stemming from a previous OIG audit (\$1.2 million) and other identified non-compliant amounts), and (iii) replaces defective condoms procured under previous programs (a value of approximately \$3.8 million).

The Country Team negotiated an agreement in June 2016 according to which the Global Fund would agree to accept payment-in-kind for specified portions of US\$ 27.4 million in exchange for the Government of Ghana's implementation of specified supply chain reforms (with concrete milestones and verification mechanisms), with a total potential payment-in-kind of the full US\$ 27.4 million. If there is a default on a specific milestone, the amount tied to that milestone would become payable after a cure period. If there is a default on other obligations owed from Ghana to the Global Fund, including repaying \$1.2 million of identified non-compliant amounts, replacing \$3.8 million of condoms, and repaying any future amounts identified under the Grant Agreements, then such amount becomes payable. Failure to repay the amount in default may result in a 2:1 reduction of that amount from the 2017-19 allocation.

Due to a change in the Government of Ghana in December 2016, the signature process for the draft agreement by the Ministries of Health and Finance was lengthy, but completed in July 2017. Senior

Grant Management is actively engaged in discussions with the new Government and technical partners (USG, DFID, UN) to expedite resolution.

The remaining US\$ 0.3 million relates to cash balances to be refunded and a small additional amount of non-compliant expenditures.

- b) United Nations Development Programme: US\$ 4.9 million (11.8%) relates to two grants in two countries, with the Democratic Republic of Congo representing the majority of this amount (US\$ 4.9 million, including US\$ 3.6 million related to the Missionpharma matter which was paid by the company in fines and confiscation orders to the Danish authorities in 2011 and that is the subject of a Settlement and Release Agreement described in greater detail below).
- c) National Agency for the Control of AIDS (Nigeria): US\$ 1.9 million (4.6%)

31. As of 30 June 2017, of grants that have outstanding non-OIG recoverable amounts, the average amount outstanding per grant is US\$ 652,986, but it should be noted that this figure is influenced by the aforementioned amounts listed in paragraph 30. As such, closer attention is warranted on the median amount, which is US\$ 77,843.

2:1 Allocation Reduction

32. 2017 has also seen the further application of the so-called "2-for-1 allocation reduction" method to resolve particularly difficult cases, where all reasonable recovery approaches have failed to produce results. Allocation reductions represent a means of resolving exceptionally difficult cases where all means of recovery have been considered exhausted. Upon approval by the Executive Director the country's allocation is reduced by a factor of 2:1, being two units of allocation reduction for every one unit of recoverable amount. This measure of last resort was applied to a case that occurred in Guatemala, and allowed the Secretariat to close the case that had an outstanding recoverable amount of US\$ 83,336 in the aggregate by deducting twice that amount from this country's existing funding allocation amounts, which amount can then be made available to fund other countries' programs.

33. There are a number of reasons why the allocation reduction approach is only applied as a last resort. Firstly, there is a negative impact on the country's available budget to fight the three diseases. Secondly, the misused funds for which the deduction is applied are not actually recovered. As a result, there may be less accountability and 'consequence' for the recipient who was responsible for ensuring that the funds were spent properly.

34. Accordingly, it is important that there is adequate visibility for the cases in which it was concluded that there was no better option but to apply the 2-for-1 allocation deduction approach, which is why the allocation reduction that occurred during the period ended 30 June 2017 is described in the following paragraphs:

Guatemala: In 2015, the Recoveries Committee recommended and the Executive Director approved a 2:1 allocation reduction relating to grants for which the Ministry of Health and Social Assistance (MSPAS) of Guatemala was the Principal Recipient; grant funds had been used to pay taxes due to internal administrative bottlenecks delaying the operationalization of the Congress-approved tax exemption. This decision to reduce an approved allocation by 2:1 was made after all other avenues and strategies for recovery had been exhausted. When a second, albeit smaller, non-OIG recoverable amount was identified by the Country Team (primarily related again to the payment of taxes in the June 2014 – December 2015 period) the Country Team reengaged with high level Ministry of Health and Finance officials to try and recover the funds.

The Country Team has repeatedly followed up with the MSPAS and Ministry of Finance requesting reimbursement of the total amount of US\$83,336. The MSPAS has indicated that it lacks the resources and legal mechanisms to refund these funds, and no progress had been made towards recovery. Given the expressed impossibility of recovering the amount, the decision was taken to

apply a further 2:1 allocation reduction, this time to the country's 2017-19 allocation, for a total reduction of US\$166,672.

What are the implications for our outlook and plans?

Post Script (Significant events occurring or expected after 30 June 2017)

- 35. While a formal Reimbursement Protocol has not been signed, the Secretariat has received commitment letters from both the Governments of Nigeria and DRC. The Government of Nigeria is expected to reimburse US\$ 5.8 million (OIG and non-OIG recoverable amounts), and the Government of the Democratic Republic of the Congo is expected to make the final payment of US\$ 1.3 million in relation to a non-OIG recoverable that forms part of the overall UNDP Settlement Agreement during the course of 2017. US\$ 2.16 million of the US\$ 5.8 million was received from the Government of Nigeria on 06 October 2017.
- 36. Ghana: In August 2017, the Government of Ghana transferred funds such as to enable the Secretariat to close off a long-running OIG recovery case amounting to US\$ 0.36 million, as well as two open non-OIG recovery cases amounting to US\$ 0.32 million. As described above, the Government of Ghana also signed the Central Medical Stores Fire Agreement addressing a US\$ 27.4 million loss.
- 37. UNDP: With respect to the non-OIG recovery case for US\$ 3.6 million, in August 2017 the Global Fund, UNDP, and Missionpharma signed a Settlement and Release Agreement. This Agreement provides for a \$575,000 cash payment by Missionpharma to the Global Fund within 30 days of the date of signature, an amount which was received by the Global Fund in early September. The parties also agreed to continue to pursue the recovery of the outstanding DKK 20,016,000 in confiscated proceeds held by the Danish authorities within a 12 month period from the date of signature, failing which Missionpharma has agreed to cover this amount. The only other outstanding amount that forms part of the Settlement Agreement relates to US\$ 0.5 million where PSI was the sub-recipient. Constructive discussions have taken place with a view to achieving resolution by the end of October 2017.
- 38. Niger: In August 2017, the Government of Niger transferred funds such that the Secretariat was able to close off a long-running OIG recovery case amounting to US\$ 0.24 million.
- 39. If the above anticipated movements were to materialize, all other things being equal, the outstanding OIG recoverable amount would be US\$ 5.4 million and the outstanding Non-OIG amount would be US\$ 8.5 million by FYE 2017.

- C. (2) A written commitment is recognized as such once signed by a competent authority, in practice usually the Ministry of Health with co-signature by the Ministry of Finance.
 - (3) Adjustments by management include changes to the OIG-reported figures based on additional considerations, which may include review of additional supporting documentation, retroactive approval of expenditures reported by the OIG as non-compliant where sound rationales exist, an evaluation of the Global Fund's available legal rights and remedies, and amounts identified by the Secretariat as recoverable in addition to the amounts reported by the OIG. Such adjustments are made in consultation with the OIG.
 - (4) The amount deemed recoverable represents the maximum amount to be recovered based on the deliberations of the Recoveries Committee and the Executive Director and latest information available. The amounts include considerable sums which are subject to further analysis or explanation by the Secretariat and validation by the OIG. Part or all such amounts may be shifted to the management adjustments column following further deliberations of the Recoveries Committee and the Executive Director.
